A Word About Communion at Redeemer:

This is a time for all people to seek the Lord. For Christians, Communion (also called The Lord’s Supper or The Eucharist, which means ‘thanksgiving’) is a time to meet with their Savior by faith, to be strengthened and renewed by Him as they eat bread and drink wine. All baptized Christians who trust in Christ alone as their Savior and Lord, belong to a church that embraces the gospel, are at peace with their fellow neighbor, and seek strength and grace to live more faithfully to Christ, are invited to participate. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and to consider more deeply your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.

## “Right on the Money”

<sup>3:9</sup> Honor the LORD with your wealth, with the firstfruits of all your crops. **Proverbs 3:9**

<sup>10:15</sup> The wealth of the rich is their fortified city, but poverty is the ruin of the poor. <sup>16</sup> The wages of the righteous bring them life, but the income of the wicked brings them punishment. **Proverbs 10:15-16**

<sup>11:1</sup> The LORD abhors dishonest scales, but accurate weights are his delight...<sup>4</sup> Wealth is worthless in the day of wrath, but righteousness delivers from death...<sup>24</sup> One man gives freely, yet gains even more; another withholds unduly, but comes to poverty. <sup>25</sup> A generous man will prosper; he who refreshes others will himself be refreshed. <sup>26</sup> People curse the man who hoards grain, but blessing crowns him who is willing to sell. <sup>27</sup> He who seeks good finds goodwill, but evil comes to him who searches for it. <sup>28</sup> Whoever trusts in his riches will fall, but the righteous will thrive like a green leaf. **Proverbs 11:1, 4, 24-28**

<sup>13:7</sup> One man pretends to be rich, yet has nothing; another pretends to be poor, yet has great wealth...<sup>11</sup> Dishonest money dwindles away, but he who gathers money little by little makes it grow...<sup>21</sup> Misfortune pursues the sinner, but prosperity is the reward of the righteous. <sup>22</sup> A good man leaves an inheritance for his children's children, but a sinner's wealth is stored up for the righteous. <sup>23</sup> A poor man's field may produce abundant food, but injustice sweeps it away. **Proverbs 13:7, 11, 21-23**

<sup>15:16</sup> Better a little with the fear of the LORD than great wealth with turmoil. **Proverbs 15:16**

<sup>19:4</sup> Wealth brings many friends, but a poor man's friend deserts him. **Proverbs 19:4**

<sup>22:1</sup> A good name is more desirable than great riches; to be esteemed is better than silver or gold. <sup>2</sup> Rich and poor have this in common: The LORD is the Maker of them all. <sup>3</sup> A prudent man sees danger and takes refuge, but the simple keep going and suffer for it. <sup>4</sup> Humility and the fear of the LORD bring wealth and honor and life...<sup>16</sup> He who oppresses the poor to increase his wealth and he who gives gifts to the rich-- both come to poverty. **Proverbs 22:1-4, 16**

<sup>23:4</sup> Do not wear yourself out to get rich; have the wisdom to show restraint. <sup>5</sup> Cast but a glance at riches, and they are gone, for they will surely sprout wings and fly off to the sky like an eagle. **Proverbs 23:4-5**

<sup>27:23</sup> Be sure you know the condition of your flocks, give careful attention to your herds; <sup>24</sup> for riches do not endure forever, and a crown is not secure for all generations. **Proverbs 27:23-24**

<sup>28:6</sup> Better a poor man whose walk is blameless than a rich man whose ways are perverse...<sup>8</sup> He who increases his wealth by exorbitant interest amasses it for another, who will be kind to the poor...<sup>11</sup> A rich man may be wise in his own eyes, but a poor man who has discernment sees through him...<sup>20</sup> A faithful man will be richly blessed, but one eager to get rich will not go unpunished...<sup>22</sup> A stingy man is eager to get rich and is unaware that poverty awaits him. **Proverbs 28:6, 8, 11, 20, 22**

<sup>30:8b</sup> Give me neither poverty nor riches, but give me only my daily bread. <sup>9</sup> Otherwise, I may have too much and disown you and say, 'Who is the LORD?' Or I may become poor and steal, and so dishonor the name of my God. **Proverbs 30:8b-9**
